Assessing the Impact of Health-Related Social Needs

- Unmet health-related social needs (HRSNs) are associated with chronic diseases such as diabetes, asthma, and HIV
- Unmet HRSNs are associated with missed primary care appointments and higher healthcare costs



Optimizing Screening and Referral Interventions

- Implementing HRSN screening and referral interventions is scalable and feasible within large health systems
- <u>Clinician engagement</u> in screening and referring influences the reach and adoption of the interventions
- Using Implementation Science methods and a Learning Health Systems approach is valuable in evaluating interventions and executing quality improvement initiatives



Integrating Community Health Workers (CHWs)

- <u>Highly functional CHW programs</u> require robust training, supportive supervision structures, community involvement, and data feedback loops
- Standardized workflows, CHW accompaniment, clinician champions, administrative liaisons, & quality improvement initiatives support health system CHW integration
- Integration of CHWs is <u>highly effective</u> in connecting patients with social services



Implementing Global Health Models to Advance Health Equity

- <u>Global learning approaches</u> are effective but not well-defined, not frequently used, and lack implementation strategies and evaluation measures
- <u>Global CHW models can be applied</u> to address HRSNs and community-level disparities
- Global learning experiences are heterogeneous but, when applied to HRSNs, community engagement is a universal theme



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
