

Expected Experiences on the Pediatric Endocrine rotation

We seek to provide you with an experience on your endocrine rotation that is interesting, balanced, and thorough to prepare you for what you need to know about endocrine as a general pediatrician. These are the experiences you should have, at minimum, during your 1 month rotation. We expect that during the rotation you will attend inpatient rounds and outpatient clinics when not attending endocrine or general pediatric conferences, attending continuity clinic, or cross-covering inpatient floors.

Inpatient

-Contact the first-year fellow on inpatient service to arrange daily rounding schedule and discuss patients for you to see

New consult (non-diabetes)	Write H+P, present differential diagnosis and assessment/plan, write notes on this patient every day as rotator's schedule allows		
Diabetic ketoacidosis	Write H+P and/or progress note, develop assessment/plan along with fellow		
New onset diabetes education	Shadow the certified diabetes educator and nutritionist as they provide education to patient + family for new onset diabetes, review the new onset education booklet		
Insulin pump start	Attend a pump start visit with the nurse practitioner		

Outpatient

-Discuss with attending whether to shadow or see patient independently and then present.
-Discuss with attending whether to write a note.
